^{1/} In FY 2006, the values for the District of Columbia were set for the state plan under titles XIX and XXI of the SSA and for capitation payments and DSH allotments under those titles. For other purposes, including programs remaining in Title IV of the Act, the percentage for DC is 50.00.

^{2/} For states awarded a grant, the MFP-enhanced FMAP is based on the SCHIP model. States will be reimbursed at an MFP-enhanced FMAP rate that is determined by increasing a state's regular FMAP by the number of percentage points that is equal to 50% of the regular state share. For example, states that are currently at 50% FMAP (CO, CT, MD, MA, MN, NH, NJ, NY, VA and WA) would be bumped up to 75%. Under the MFP-enhanced FMAP provision in the current version, no state would be allowed to exceed 90% MFP-enhanced FMAP. For FY 2006, the 90% cap would not apply because the highest percentages for the FY 2006 MFP-enhanced rate is 88% (Mississippi).
